## ***Western Australian Chairman's Annual Report 2022***

For the Association, this year has been as busy as ever with the effects on clubs of COVID, the many iterations to the fixtures, the metro modified age group trial, the registration system change to PlayHQ, the addition of 4 new metro sides, the revamp of the women's subcommittee, the introduction of the Quickkick program and the inevitable impact of hosting the National Carnival last year. At the end of the day, we played footy and for the most part under the umbrella of Footy for Kicks.

Having just returned from a very successful ambush on Adelaide at the National Masters Carnival, with a touring party of just over 300, 217 players, 3 of our teams successfully won their respective titles with congratulations to those who won divisional medals and All Australian selection. In addition to this Damon Rossi, was awarded the Rising Star Award within the Umpire group, and for most was the Umpire of the Carnival. We also acknowledged some significant contributions by 3 legends of AFL Masters WA by naming 3 new WA State Fairest and Best Awards after Linlee Taylor, Trevor Staniforth and Neville Clarke, all worthy of this honour.

### *Charity Partnerships*

During the year we have strengthened our alignment partnerships with the following charities :

- Keep Your Feet
- Paraplegic Benefit Fund (PBF)
- Prostate Cancer Foundation of Australia (PCFA)

This year we held a PCFA Awareness round where we sold blue football socks with PCFA logo on them, with all profits being forwarded to PCFA as fundraising.

### *Umpiring*

Our Umpire group is getting stronger and with the assistance of the Umpiring group within the WAFC, our umpires will be given every opportunity to improve their skills by attending structured training sessions tailored to community level umpires. We have requested every club, metro or regional, male or female, promote and provide at least one qualified umpire to adjudicate on a regular basis. The association will cover any costs associated with becoming qualified. Special thanks to Rob Cox for his umpire co-ordination this year, kindly supported by John Manuel.

### *Cards/Tribunals/Suspensions*

This year saw an increase in yellow and red cards mainly attributed to more games being played throughout the state than in our history and interestingly 33 % of the cards occurred during night metro fixtures. In metro we had 22 cards in total, of which 16 were yellow, with 6 red cards meaning suspensions ranged from one week to four weeks with 2 occasions where we did have to enlist the Community Football Tribunal. One charge with upheld with guilty charge and the other was dismissed.

### *Radio Show – 91.3 SportFm*

The Saturday morning radio show was another success this year, even though our time on air moved from 8am to 7am, due to station commitments. Thanks to Andy Mathers for work producing the show along with our sponsors EWA Electrical Wholesalers and Burley Sekem, and thanks to those who provided content or contacts in 2022.

### *Regional Carnivals*

Unfortunately during the season of 2022, we had to cancel two pre-season carnivals due to health restrictions as we delayed the start of regular 2022 season. Thanks to the Busselton Football Club for hosting the June Long weekend South West Carnival, a massive success with 18 teams participating. Well done to Newman Vets, for hosting their highly successful celebrity game in September, and to the Miners, as the Kalgoorlie’s Masters Carnival is going from strength to strength, as more mining companies participate and together the fundraising effort is nothing short of amazing.

We are planning for the return of the Kulin and Jurien Bay pre-season carnivals with the help of the local footy club, and the working relationship we have with WA Country Football through Community Football Advisory Council. It is a focus for the Board to ensure as many opportunities or possibilities exist for metro clubs to go regional, or regions travel to a different region to get an extra few games. As always the local hospitality is second to none, and the bus trip becomes the envy of those who don’t go.



### *Awards for 2022*

As we didn’t hold the event in 2021 with the clash of the National Carnival, the bi annual Hall of Fame Event was moved to October this year at Optus Stadium, and going forward the Board will make the premium event every 3 years. This year 4 new Life Members, 8 new Hall of Famers, Metro and Country Clubs of the Year were awarded and given their opportunity to receive their acknowledgements for the efforts in Masters Footy.

### *ALFMWA Historical Subcommittee*

This sub-committee never really got together this year, however, thanks to Mike “Patch” Adams we collated and scanned photos and articles documenting AFL Masters WA history from 1982, from a club and state point of view. 2022 will see this group get together and continue the generation of the electronic database of information.

### *Ladies Subcommittee*

The focus of this group of enthusiastic people was to grow and develop the women's side of AFLMWA and in 2022, we achieved nominating 2 touring sides into the National Carnival, and for the first time had structured regular metro fixtures for the women. At the end of the season we had 5 clubs participate and provide opportunities for women who wanted to play football in our metro competition. Thanks to the committee members who went above and beyond to assist clubs and teams in metro and in the southwest.



### *By-Laws Change – 2022 Trial of Age Brackets*

After many hours of considering the proposals put to the Board in previous years and during 2021 the Board took the decision to trial an age bracket change for metro male competition in 2022.

A review was completed mid-season, and to aid clubs with some flexibility the age bracket was changed to include anyone who was on the cusp of moving age groups and had a birthday within 6 months of that game day, were able to play in the lower or upper age group.

The Trial Age Brackets of AFLMWA Metropolitan Men's competition was:

- Supers – 35 years to 42 years.
- Masters – 43 years to 49 years.
- Seniors – 50 years and over

With the following caveats/club requirements:

- No dispensation for players to play UP one grade unless subject to medical advice with documentation provided and approved by AFL Masters WA Board to play.
- You cannot play in the age group until you have had your birthday and turn the appropriate age to be eligible.
- Clubs (both) that play in a game where the "even up" rule is utilised are to email the Board Administrator within 48 hours providing the even up rule numbers the game commenced with (both the club with less than 18 and the club effected are to provide this email)

- Registered players in PLAY HQ to be allocated to Supers, Masters, Seniors by date of birth default system. Players that play "down" to be written on team sheet and submitted to Board Administrator within 48 hours of completion of game, signed by one umpire.
- 100% compliance with Play HQ within 72 hours of fixture, only players that play to be on team list. WA AFL Masters By Law 10.8 Failure to finalise the online Team Sheet within 72 hours of the game being completed - maximum \$200 fine to be issue for non-compliance
- Over 60's games (identified during season fixtures) to replace Over 55s games with players who play in these games not to play in member club games during the same fixture
- Over 60s games to be North v South with each having host club to organise on rotating basis (ie North (N Warriors) v South (Makos) as per 2022 fixtures.
- Each club to have identified club contact for Play HQ with name/s provided to Board Administrator prior to 1st March 2022.



#### *Vale Bruce Arlow*

During October, Bruce Arlow lost his medical battle and passed away, Bruce was the convener of our Association, the inaugural President from 1982 to 1994, 1988 to 1993 National AFL Masters President, Inaugural Life Member of our Association in 1994, inducted into the National AFL Masters Hall of Fame in 1998, Inaugural member of AFLMWA Hall of Fame in 2012, named one of four Legends at the Northern Warriors in their 40th year, played in 11 National Carnivals for WA, has the honour of his name on the Bruce Arlow WA Most Valuable Masters Player at National Carnival, is survived by his Wife and 3 adult children, jovial to the end. Condolences to the family and Northern Warriors Football Club. RIP Bruce.

#### *Thankyous*

Thanks to all club Presidents, delegates and committees and their exiting or incoming volunteers for your efforts in 2022, and we look forward to 2023 with an open mind.

Thanks to Tony Collins, Dave Farrell and Darren Eiffler who nominated for the Board this year, Congratulations to all the three (3) who were elected, and if you were unsuccessful please come back and get involved at subcommittee level, with the intention of re-nominating in years to come.

As per usual, a special mention to the existing Board member Rob Cox, and his partner Naomi, it's never an easy job volunteering, thank you for what you have brought to the table and to the impact you have had on the Association, not only in the Governance and Umpiring domains, or the event organising, but also as a level headed sounding board.

## ***2022 Hall of Fame Legends elevations***



### ***Ian Fletcher (Victorian Metropolitan)***

It is with great pleasure AFL Masters elevates to legend status from the AFL Masters National Board – Ian Fletcher. Back in 1992 Ian joined the Essendon AFL Superules club where he has played there for the last 30 years, coaching all divisions Essendon has been involved in.

After starting the Masters (Seconds) competition in Vic Metro, Ian then joined their State Executive Board in 1999 and was made Life Member of Vic Metro two years later. In 2003, Ian became Vic Metro – President/Administrator – a role he held until 2012. In this period Ian introduced an Over 47's, Over 50's and Over 55's competitions.

In 1994, Ian attended his first carnival in Perth as player & coach of the 40's side. Before the start of the 2022 National Carnival, Ian's teams have been divisional champions 16 times – a remarkable record.

After helping out Vic Metro, Fletch decided to join the AFL Masters National Board as director in 2013. Three years later he became AFL Masters National Vice President, a position he currently holds.

As a sign of his fantastic commitment and passion, Ian has only missed 2 carnivals this century. He has progressed through each of the divisional age groups now in the which he declares will probably be the last.

### ***Gail Dykes (Tasmania)***

After attending her first National Carnival in Hobart in 1993, the 2022 Adelaide edition is Gail Dykes 30<sup>th</sup> appearance!

Since then Gail has done virtually every job possible either on the Tasmanian State Committee or in the background. She has been a long-time secretary, Treasurer, Accommodation Person, Match Manager (on numerous occasions), Uniform Person, Registration Administrator, Water person, Flag Bearer, and Aboriginal Grants Person. Gail was recognized for her dedication to Tasmanian Superules with life membership in 1999 and being inducted into their Hall of Fame just five years later.

### ***Tony Lovett (Victorian Country)***

It is with great pleasure that we announce Tony Lovett as an inductee into our AFL Masters Hall of Fame.

In AFL Masters football Tony Lovett on and off field has done it all! Whether in his roles at Ballarat and Vic Country, or his push for Indigenous representation in Masters football, he is always working for the betterment of AFL Masters.

Tony's work in AFL Masters footy is mirrored in everything he does – attack every opportunity with full commitment and is an integral part of everything he gets involved in. Tony arrived at Ballarat Masters in the early 2000's and quickly became a part of the Ballarat Masters fabric as a coach and long-time committee member. He was inducted as a Ballarat Diggers Legend earlier this year.

At Vic Country level, Tony's CV is just as spectacular and his ability to deliver is second to none. With ten years on the board – 4 as President – Tony can gather the troops and lead them as few others can, his aura around Masters football and the wider community is encapsulating. Since 2004, he has made 17 appearances and been named All-Australian twice.

### ***Bryan Minns (NSW)***

It is with great pleasure that we announce our second AFL Masters Hall of Fame inductee, Bryan ‘Minnsy’ Minns

Since 2007, Bryan has been instrumental in NSW AFL Masters as both a Player and Administrator. At club level he is a former 2-time President & Secretary of the Sydney AFL Masters Club, serving 11 years on their committee. In this capacity, he helped establish the “footy for fun” philosophy in Sydney Masters and help grow participation in the game. At his current club, Balmain AFC Masters, he has not only been a loyal player but also a key advisor on establishing the new masters club.

Bryan has been on the NSW AFL Masters Committee for 10 years - 7 as President. In 2018, his work with AFL Sydney helped re-establish an AFL Masters competition in Sydney, a competition well represented by 2 NSW AFL Masters associated clubs, Southern Dingoes & Balmain AFC.

As a player, Bryan is a 2 time All Australian and winner of 8 club Best and Fairest. He has participated in 3 International Tours with the Australian Masters team and has been named in the NSW AFL Masters team of the decade. Bryan also coached the Women’s NSW Team in 2019.

### ***Dom Sita (Victorian Metropolitan)***

AFL Masters are please to induct Dom Sita to the AFL Masters Hall of Fame.

Dom has accrued an incredible list of achievements with the AFL Masters Vic Metro League and annual AFL Masters National Carnival, as player and Director. Dom began his association with Vic Metro Superules in 2005 and has played over 147 games (to this date) with Footscray District Superules and Williamstown. He also played with East Brunswick Masters for 4 years and North Sunshine in the mid 90's. Dom has won 5 Best and Fairest awards and many leading goal kicker awards during his career.

Dom has served on the Vic Metro Board since 2007, being AFL Masters Carnival Director since 2013 and the League Vice President since 2018. He was duly awarded Life Membership of Vic Metro in 2016.

Dom's first Carnival appearance was in Cairns 2004. He has competed every year since (except 2020/21 due to Covid restrictions). He has won Best & Fairest in 2013 and 2015 for 45s, played in multiple Carnival winning teams and has 7 All Australian awards.

Dom is a well-regarded member and hardworking Director with Vic Metro, who more than meets the criteria for AFL Masters Hall of Fame honours.

Deb has been involved with She has been involved in AFL Masters SA at a State level for many years and is still actively involved. She has assisted the National Board Ladies at several carnivals, highly respected by her peers and most deserving of being inducted into the Hall of Fame.

Deb is currently the AFL Masters SA team Manager Coordinator. She has participated in AFL Masters Carnivals for SA since 1993, predominately in the role of Team Manager, some 27 plus years, generally catering for 2 Teams.

She has been involved as a club Delegate for South Coast Roosters Masters from 1988, but from 1994 was a Female Coach/Manager, possibly the first in any Superrules side in Australia!

Having represented AFL Masters SA in National Carnivals since 1993 as both Runner & Team Manager, Deb has accrued a long list of achievements cumulating in being awarded Life Membership to AFL Masters SA in 1998. She has been the recipient of The Bill McDonald Award for the Most Valuable contributor to a National Carnival no less than 4 times (1993, 1998, 2010, 2015) and received the AFL Masters SA Presidents Award, 2019 for services to the association.

## 2022 AFL MASTERS NATIONAL CARNIVAL



The 39<sup>th</sup> AFL Masters National Carnival was held in Adelaide from 25 September to 1 October 2022. 1228 players took part with a further 339 officials participating during the week.

The tournament's media partner was News Corp with 41 games live streamed by their KommunityTV across the four matchdays. Patrick Keam reported on the Carnival after each day as follows:

After a huge week of action, all age group winners at the AFL Masters National Carnival in Adelaide have now been decided.

### **Men 35s**

South Australia pulled off one of the grand final boilovers of the carnival, upsetting a strong Tasmanian side to take the high-level men's over 35s title. Tassie, the dominant side in the

division over the past decade, came into the decider having recorded 71 and 76-point victories in the opening two matches.

But the Croweaters were also undefeated and pulled off an impressive 10.4 (64) to 7.6 (48) triumph to claim the premiership. Their dominance was reflected in the All-Australian team with seven selections including coach Mark Good. Tasmania's Jade Child's consistently outstanding carnival was recognised with the best and fairest award.

### ***Women 35s***

A defensive masterclass in the grand final helped Victoria Country over the line against competition surprise-packet the ACT in the women's over 35s division. The Big V turned it on when it mattered, restricting their opponents to just one goal in the 4.3 (27) to 1.2 (8) win.

Former GWS Giants AFLW player Kate Greenacre took out the competition best and fairest for the ACT, which made its inaugural visit to the carnival in this division.

### ***Men 40s***

Experience told more than anywhere in the men's over 40s title clash as South Australia Red crushed Victoria Country with the help of a host of former SANFL talents.

Six players with state league experience – Ben Newberry, Andrew Bachman, Joe Pedler, Marcuss Burdett, Mathew Thomas Jon Floreani – were crucial as the Croweaters won the grand final 11.15 (81) to 2.3 (15). Burdett was also named the division's best and fairest.



### ***Women 40s***

In the inaugural women's over 40s competition at the carnival, NSW triumphed by nine points over Western Australia. The dominant NSW conceded its only goals of the tournament in the 3.6 (24) to 2.3 (15) grand final win.





### ***Men 45s***

Western Australia had dual successes in the men's over 45s competitions as it claimed the division one title and also won the division two grand final in a combined team with the Northern Territory. The division two decider was one of the matches of the carnival with WA/NT defeating NSW 4.4 (28) to 4.3 (27).

### ***Men 50s***

Western Australia also found success in the men's over 50s division one competition. The Sandgroppers beat Victoria Metro in the grand final, although the Big V managed to take home the division two title.



### ***Men 55s***

A one-point grand final victory made success even more sweet for Victoria Metro in the men's over 55s. The 5.2 (32) to 5.1 (31) triumph over Queensland was led by best and fairest John Allinson.



### ***Men 60s***

In what became a consistent theme across the older men's divisions at the national carnival, Victoria Metro were hard to beat in the over 60s. They took care of a strong SA side in the division one grand final, while Queensland scored victory in the second tier decider.

### ***Men 65s***

The oldest division at the carnival was played for the first time in Adelaide and Victoria Metro's men's over 65s team made it four titles in total for the Big V. The wily Victorians defeated SA in the grand final.

The National Carnival concluded with 1679 attending the Gala Night at the Adelaide Convention Centre.

The individual stars of the AFL Masters National Carnival have been revealed following an action-packed week of football in Adelaide for the 2022 edition.

Ex-SANFL and AFLW players were among those who claimed best and fairest awards along and champions of old who showed they have still got it. ## IN MEMORIAM

### *Angus Adams (Tasmania)*

It is with extreme sadness that we advise that AFL Masters Life Member – Angus Adams - passed away on 22 January 2023 following a long battle with illness.

Angus sat on the National Board in 1994 and 1995 but probably best remembered as the long-serving President of AFL Masters Tasmania for more than a decade from 1992 to 2004. He was instrumental in setting up the very first Tasmanian Superules team in 1982 and was named in the Tasmanian Superules Team of the Quarter Century.

Angus' contribution was rightly acknowledged as a Life Member of AFL Masters in 1998. He was elevated to Legends Status in 2016 after being initially inducted into the AFL Masters Hall of Fame in 1999.

The AFL Masters National Board send their deepest condolences to the Adams family and thank him for his contribution to our code. RIP Angus.

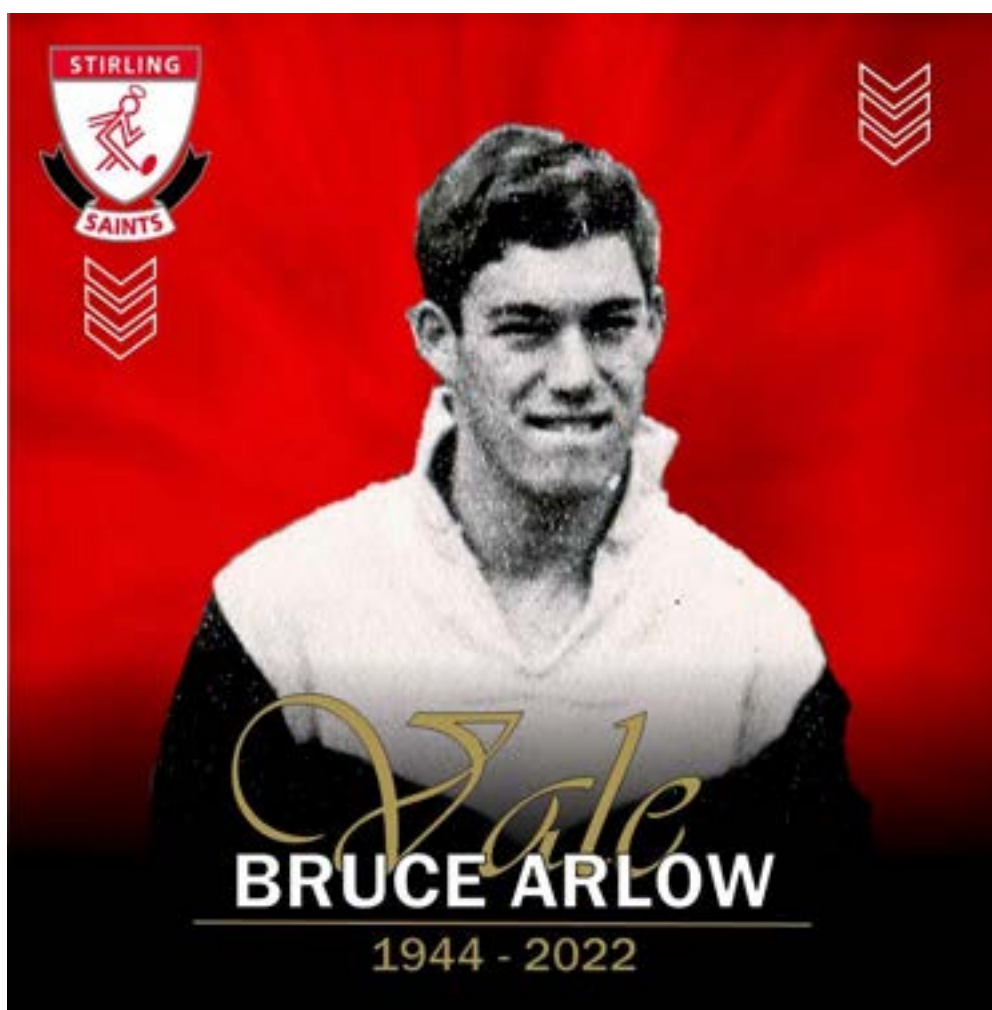


## ***Bruce Arlow (Western Australia)***

It is with extreme sadness that we advise that the 4th ever President of AFL Masters – Bruce Arlow - passed away on 14 October 2022. Bruce was National President for 7 years between 1988-1994 – the third longest reign in our history - and was a long-time servant of WA Masters. Bruce's contribution was rightly acknowledged in the 2nd induction into the AFL Masters Hall of Fame in 1998.

Bruce was the original convenor of the WA Masters Association, inaugural President from 1982 to 1994, 1988 to 1993 National AFL Masters President, Inaugural WA Masters Life Member in 1988, Northern Warriors Life Member in 1994, inducted in National AFL Masters Hall of Fame in 1998, Inaugural member of AFLMWA Hall of Fame in 2012. Named one of four Legends at Northern Warriors in their 40th year, played 11 National Carnivals from 1983 for WA and has the honour of his name on the Bruce Arlow WA Most Valuable Masters Player at National Carnival. He is survived by wife and 3 adult children, jovial to end.
