

AFL MASTERS LEGENDS GUIDELINES

This policy is applicable to AFL Masters Inc.

Purpose

Each Year the National Board will consider the elevation of up to two Hall of Fame inductees to Legend status. This will be taken from the pool of Hall of Fame members only. Its intention is to recognise the absolute best of the best who have not only given outstanding service to AFL Masters but exemplary service.

Objective

To recognise the most *exemplary* contribution and service by an individual to AFL Masters.

Principles

- 1. It is a most prestigious *Award*, NOT A RIGHT OR A MILESTONE.
- 2. To recognise not only outstanding service, but *exemplary* contribution to the benefit of the organisation. This must be identified for elevation to be considered.
- 3. Contributions should be substantial.

Guidelines

- 1. Players, umpires, administrators and supporters are eligible for nomination.
- 2. Candidates from each State and Territory who are Hall of Fame are the only source of nomination.
- 3. An independent panel nominates candidates for elevation to the National Board.
- 4. Up to two nominations will be elevated to Legend status each year.
- 5. Nominees are expected to have contributed 25 years' service to Superules/Masters Australian Football/AFL Masters.
- 6. The decision of the National Board is final.

Review of Guidelines

These guidelines will be reviewed every two years, by the National Board, or sooner if warranted by internal or external events or changes.
